

2030 AGENDA & SDG IMPLEMENTATION CHALLENGES IN THE ARAB REGION

58% world refugees originated from the Arab region (2016) of which **60%** continue to live in the region



GOVERNANCE, PEACE & SECURITY Recurrent/protracted conflicts and crises massive forced displacements: How to leave nocountry and no-one behind? Institutional Weakness, accountability gaps **Violent Extremism**

60% less than 30 years old

IS THIS ENOUGH?


➤ Need to better understand what *intimately* drives, and critically, what inhibits young men and women to engage in entrepreneurship and take business risks
